






Removed

 - Graphing Calculator
 - Scrapbook




Extensions Manager



- Device drivers
 - Only loaded when needed
- Modifications
 - Startup **Applications**




File Exchange



- Functionality
 - Mac OS X uses extensions (.jpg, .pdf, .mpg, etc.)
 - Extensions can be hidden


Memory

 - UNIX memory management






- Mac OS X alternatives

 - Shareware Apps






- Control Panels

 - Dock (Application Menu and Launcher)
































































- Put Away (第-Y)

 - F12 button on portables





Apple Menu


Different color

 - Location
 - Sleep, Restart, Shutdown



Window Behavior


- No new window on opening a folder
 - Hide toolbar to change

Window Behavior

- Mac OS X interface more customizable
 - Background color or picture
 - Font Size
 - Icon Size

Mice

- One button mouse default
 - Right click = control-click



Multi-button mice are supported




Both platforms support USB



Menu Bar

- Windows
 - A menu bar for every window
- Mac OS X
 - One menu bar at top of screen
 - Some ported apps have one per window



Desktop

- Windows
 - /Documents and Settings/<name>/Desktop
- Mac OS X
 - /Users/<name>/Desktop





Browsing

- Windows
 - Windows Explorer
- Mac OS X
 - Finder
 - Click on Desktop
 - Click on icon in Dock









Control Panel

- Windows
 - Windows Control Panel
- Mac OS X
 - System Preferences







Task Bar



- Windows
 - Task Bar
- Mac OS X
 - Dock
 - Launch Applications
 - Running Application have a triangle
 - Add/remove applications by dragging in/out of Dock
 - Click Yellow button to minimize windows into Dock





Keystrokes


- Windows
 - Control key shortcuts
- Mac OS X
 - Command key shortcuts
 - Save: 第-S
 - Copy: 第-C
 - Paste: 第-V
 - Close Window: 第-W
 - Quit: 第-Q
 - Switching Application: 第-Tab
 - More key short cuts in Menus

Terminal

- Other UNIX variants
 - xTerm
- Mac OS X
 - Terminal.app
 - bash
 - csh
 - sh (default for shell scripting)
 - tcsh (default for users)
 - zsh








Terminal Settings

- Other UNIX variants
 - .xinitrc
- Mac OS X
 - "Window Settings..." in Terminal





Windowing System

- Other UNIX variants
 - X Window System
- Mac OS X
 - Quartz
 - X11 available as a beta Final version in Mac OS X 10.3 "Panther"
 - Third-party X11 available












/etc/

- Other UNIX variants
 - /etc/*
- Mac OS X
 - NetInfo







root

- Other UNIX variants
 - "root" on by default
- Mac OS X
 - "root" off by default More secure "sudo"

File System

- /var/ and /usr/ are hidden
 - Do "ls /" to view hidden folders
- Additional directories
 - Applications/
 - Developer/
 - Library/
 - System/
 - Users/
 - Volumes/





Hidden Files

- Prefixing with a "."
- hidden in root directory
- HFS+
 - SetFile with Developer Tools



Aliases vs. Links

- Macintosh aliases
 - Cocoa, Carbon, and Classic apps
 - Not UNIX applications
- UNIX links
 - All four can use





Applications

- UNIX applications in Mac OS X
 - /usr/bin
 - /usr/local/bin
 - /usr/sbin
 - /usr/share
 - /usr/libexec
- To get a full list:
 - Control-x then control-d in Terminal

- More on the way







Integration File Servers

- Supported Protocols
 - Supports both client and server abilities
 - Mac Servers (AFP)
 - Windows Servers (SMB/CIFS)
 - UNIX Servers (NFS)
 - Network Browsing (Rendezvous)
 - Internet File Servers (WebDAV)



Integration File Servers

- Prosoft: NetWare Client for Mac OS X
- Thursby: ADmitMac and DAVE



Integration File Translators

- MacLink Plus
- Over 6,000 Mac OS X applications
 - Many are cross-platform
 - Huge range of supported file types
